### ***Substitution of Natural Roots for Individual Implants***

Since memorable times, man has tried to replace his missing dental pieces with different types of implants. In the past, positioning individual crowns over implants was spoken about only when dealing with one single missing tooth and generally for reconstruction of the mandible and the maxilla with individual crowns over implants. Where it is possible, and if the bone permits (speaking of the ideal bone), one can make equal the number of roots that were lost and replace them with the same number of implants.
